DAY 1 Mazandarani

• Location: Northern Iran

Population: 4 million

Music of the Heart

Farideh's heart began to race as her father walked around the large circle of women sitting behind their oversize tambourines—round drums resting on the ground. When he reached the bride and groom, the first notes flowed from his wooden flute and shouts of joy filled the garden. This wedding was the first time Farideh had been invited to perform music with the other women in her village. Despite spending years learning the distinct rhythm and beats of their region, she was still nervous.

Taking a deep breath, she listened for the note from her father that would launch the rest of the musicians. When it came, the women moved as one, striking their drums with open hands in a shower of joy. Her worries vanished as she let the rhythm surround her.

Music and dance had been an important part of festivities in her village for centuries, so Farideh felt honored to be part of this group that carried on a vibrant musical legacy. She hoped to have many more opportunities to celebrate.



Ways to Pray

- Ask God to reveal the Source of all hope and joy to Mazandaranis like Farideh.
- Pray for Mazandaranis to see how God has uniquely made them to worship Him through their music.
- Pray that there will be many celebrations in heaven as Mazandarani men and women come to know and follow Christ.

Rashad seemed to love the majestic mountains and fertile river valleys of their home in Azerbaijan. He was always eager to learn and happy to practice the skills he'd been taught to keep their herd healthy and growing. One day, Vugar would pass along all that he had built to his son.

But lately, he wondered if his sheep, a home in the mountains, and his devout Muslim beliefs were enough of an inheritance. Many of his relatives had moved to neighboring countries and large cities in pursuit of more money and opportunities. Could there be something more he should pass on to his son?

- Ask the Lord to bring an end to conflicts in this region, which have caused hardships for its inhabitants for generations.
- Pray that Azeri fathers will come to know Jesus as Lord and tell their children the truth of God's Word.
- The Azeris are sometimes called the gateway people to the Muslim world. Pray that many Azeri men and women will follow Christ and share their hope with friends and family around the globe.

DAY 3 **Rohingya**

Location: Bangladesh, Myanmar, and Southeast Asia

A Home of Their Own

Hugging her three children close, Zurah watched their apartment building—with all of their belongings inside—burn. As the heat from the flames pressed toward them, her eldest daughter buried her face in her hands, sobs shaking her shoulders.

Zurah was thankful they were all safe, but this apartment had been their hope. After being forced from Myanmar with hundreds of thousands of other Muslim Rohingya during a brutal genocide, they had survived in refugee camps in Bangladesh for years. But they continued to struggle. No employer would hire them. No landlord wanted to rent to them.

Only a few months ago, Zurah had received the key to this apartment, but it too had been taken from them. Despite all the pain, she felt in her heart that there had to be a place for her people. Someone wanted them and would welcome them. And she would keep searching until she found that person.



Ways to Pray

- Ask God to reveal Himself to the Rohingya and show them they belong with Him.
- Pray that the Lord will comfort the brokenhearted and heal the hearts of the mistreated.
- Pray for an end to oppression and injustice toward this people group and that they will know they are precious in Jesus' eyes.

Answers to Every Question

Omar ran to the field where he often played football—soccer to some foreigners—with his friends after their college classes ended. He always looked forward to their games, but today, he was even more excited, hoping to talk to the young American engineer named Mark who had joined them last time.

Mark worked in the oil business and had told Omar he could be successful in the same career. After looking into the courses he would need to take, Omar had more questions and hoped for an opportunity to ask them.

He also wondered if Mark was a Christian. Perhaps he could give Omar more information on part of the *Injil* he'd read on social media. Had Jesus really said that you had to be a servant to be great? That made sense on the football field where Omar often passed the ball to help his team score. But why would someone do that in his everyday life?



Ways to Pray

- Pray for young Libyan Arabs to seek answers to their questions and find the truth in Jesus.
- Some Libyan Arabs have found wealth and status due to an abundance of oil in the land. Ask God to show them that money can't bring real fulfillment.
- Other Libyan Arabs are impoverished and barely surviving. Pray that God will meet their physical needs and show them how He alone can satisfy their spiritual needs.

Searching for Protection

Ten-year-old Achmad scurried to the side of the road—as far away as he could get from the grove of trees on the edge of town. Adjusting the bag of local fruit his mom had asked him to pick up, he tried to hurry, but his cargo weighed him down. If he slowed too much, he feared he wouldn't make it by unscathed.

Everyone in his village knew that dark powers lived in those trees. His best friend had even become ill and nearly died after walking by them.

Achmad didn't want to die. But his dad, his grandfather, and even the Imam didn't know how to protect their village from the supernatural forces they believed inhabited the trees. There had to be someone who could save them.

Complete Joy



Ways to Pray

- Pray for movements of faith among Hui people across China.

While Bohra women generally wore bright colors to distinguish themselves from other Muslim women in the area who wore black, this bright green *rida* with its intricate embroidery would make her shine even among her own people.

After checking one more time in the mirror, she left her home to meet Nadira and three other friends for coffee. As she approached the table where they sat, her heart sank. Nadira was wearing a new *rida* too, and their friends couldn't stop talking about her incredible talent and skill.

Faiza sighed as she walked home. No one had said anything about her new clothes. She'd felt invisible. There had to be someone who saw her and knew her. She just hadn't met that Person yet.



Ways to Pray

- Ask God to provide ways for Frontiers field workers to enter the insular community of the Bohra.
- Ask the Lord to reveal Himself to Bohra men and women in miraculous and mighty ways so they will know who He truly is.
- Pray for movements of faith to spread among the Bohra and beyond, all for God's glory.



When Gamal smiled at her, her stomach filled with nervous flutters. She hoped he would be a good man. She knew little about him except that he was wealthy; the racing camels he raised brought in top dollar from buyers across Sudan and the Arabian Peninsula.

But money would not be enough to make them happy. Some men in her village loved possessions more than their wives and families. Although her mother had assured her that Gamal followed Islam, Rania wondered if that would be enough to bring them joy in their marriage.



Ways to Pray

- Pray for wealthy Rashaida men and women to discover that true joy comes with knowing Christ and storing up treasures in heaven.
- Pray that the few followers of Jesus among the Rashaida will grow strong in their faith and boldly share the hope they have found.
- Pray that their vivid culture will include the knowledge of and trust in the Lord.

"I don't want you to be part of that group," Karrar declared to his 20-year-old daughter Esraa. "You could be in danger."

"But, *Baba*," Esraa pleaded. "We only want to see Sunnis reclaim some influence so that there will be jobs available for my generation. We want education, public services, and unity for our country. Is that so wrong?"

Karrar frowned at her. After decades of conflict that had begun long before Esraa was even born, he too longed to have a voice in his country. But the youth movement his daughter had joined guaranteed only risk and conflict. "I forbid it," he repeated.

Esraa stomped down the hall and slammed her bedroom door behind her. Karrar wondered how there could ever be peace in their country, if he couldn't even have harmony in his home.



Ways to Pray

- Pray that God will open the hearts of Sunni Arabs in Iraq to the true source of peace and harmony—Jesus Christ.
- Ask the Lord to use audio recordings of the Gospels and radio broadcasts to reach many Iraqis with the Good News.
- Pray that heads of families will turn and follow Jesus and share the hope that they've found with all their relatives.

Wishing for Peace

As the morning sun rose, Dolo pushed his boat into the harbor and rowed toward his usual fishing spot. When he neared his friend Aree's boat, he greeted him. Aree was usually talkative and smiling, but this morning, Aree barely waved before throwing his net into the clear blue water.

Dolo understood. After a recent clash between the Thai government and a rebel group in the southern provinces where his people, the Pattani Malay, lived, he didn't feel like talking either. His people had experienced violence and repression ever since the government demanded the Pattani Malay assimilate into Thai culture almost a hundred years ago. And there seemed to be no hope of a resolution.

Despite the ongoing conflict, Dolo knew he had to focus on providing for his family. If he didn't fish, his family would have nothing to eat. But he wished he didn't have to worry about their safety, too.



Ways to Pray

- Pray for God's peace to reign in southern Thailand and to end violence and fear.
- Ask the Lord to provide for the physical and spiritual needs of Pattani Malay men, women, and children—many of whom live in deep poverty.
- Ask God to draw Pattani Malays to Him and then send them out to become fishers of men.

Q Location: Afghanistan


Population: Approx. 800,000

Farzad picked up his two-year-old grandson and swung him high in the air among the mountains far north of the city. The boy giggled and begged for more, but Farzad set him down. There was still much more work to be done before he could rest for the day.

As he harvested the wheat in his rocky hillside field, Farzad told the little boy stories about his life and his people. Like many others, in his youth, Farzad had traveled between Pashayi villages during the harvest season. At each stop, he sang songs and told stories about his own home.

Lately, Farzad had been hearing stories of Pashayi talking with outsiders. In their tight-knit community, news traveled fast, and Farzad prayed that the village council would put an end to the actions of a few—for the sake of his family and the generations to come.



Ways to Pray

- The Pashayi remain very closed off to outsiders—especially foreigners. Pray that they will welcome those who carry the Gospel.
- Pray that the full Bible and ministry resources will be translated into the four distinct Pashayi languages so that this people will encounter the one true God.
- Pray that this region will experience a bountiful harvest as many Muslims turn to the Lord.

HOPE FOR THE PEOPLE



So, even with limited resources, he offered whatever care he could to other displaced peoples. He set broken bones, bandaged wounds, and distributed the meager medicine he could obtain.

In every face, Mostafa saw heartache and despair. Each man, woman, and child was desperate for hope. But his training—and even Islam had not taught him how to treat emotional wounds. Early in his medical career, he'd learned that if he didn't have the answer, he should research until he found one. So, that's exactly what he would do.



Ways to Pray

- Pray that refugees and those longing for hope will seek Jesus and find the Answer to all their needs.
- Pray for God to bring peace to this war-torn land.
- Ask God to show those who have been displaced by the civil war in Syria that they belong with Him and Jesus is their sure foundation.

This group of seven friends had been meeting to study the *Injil* together for several weeks, despite the danger. Ways to Pray

- Praise God that the small church in Turkmenistan continues to grow despite constant threat.
- Ask God to raise up bold Muslim-background believers among the Turkmen who will preach the Gospel without fear.
- Pray that the government will open the country to more foreign workers seeking to serve the Turkmen people and carry the Good News.

Dignity and Respect

It had been only ten years since the conflict between the Turkish army and the Kurdish militants erupted in the heart of the city where Yusuf used to live with his young family. Then, he worried about their lives as bullets flew through the streets. Now, he worried about his teenage sons' futures.

While violence in the city was less common these days, Kurds like Yusuf were still a despised and suspected minority, often denied basic human rights. He didn't want his children to know that life.

A new friend had recently given Yusuf a copy of the *Injil* in his own language, and something he'd read made him think integrity and dignity were keys to acceptance and respect. He would begin teaching his sons to live this way, too.



Ways to Pray

- Pray that Kurds will have access to and read the Word of God.
- Pray that as they discover wisdom in Scripture and apply it to their lives, they will see the truth of who Jesus is and declare Him Lord and Savior.
- Ask God to bring peace and understanding to this region that has endured violent conflicts for many years.

Ways to Pray

- Praise God that He controls the wind and the rain. Ask Him to display His might to the Dargin.
- Pray that this people will be released from centuries of belief in superstitions and folk-Islam and find true freedom in Jesus Christ.
- Pray that the Bible will soon be fully translated into a local dialect and available for Dargin men and women to engage with the Word of God.

"As the eldest daughter, I will inherit everything. Then, as the *ninik* mamak, my brother will manage my home and watch over my children and our family's heirlooms." Sunarti frowned suddenly. "I've met other students who think it's strange that daughters are the heirs among my people. Do you think so?"

Chelsea smiled. "Not at all. The *Injil* says all children—sons and daughters—can be heirs of God. Can I show you?" Sunarti quickly agreed and leaned closer to read the words on Chelsea's phone.



Ways to Pray

- Pray that the mothers of the Minangkabau people will come to know and follow Christ and will share the Good News with their children.
- Ask God to make Himself known among Muslim students at Indonesian universities so that movements of faith will spread to their people groups throughout the country.
- Praise God for opportunities and open doors for teams to find residency and share the Gospel. Ask Him to raise up workers to go.


As Christ Forgives

Ways to Pray

- Pray for the Tubu Teda to recognize that Jesus is the only way to peace and an end to violence among them.
- Pray that audio Scripture will be available to the Tubu Teda, that they will hear and follow the Word of God.
- Ask God to reveal Himself through dreams and visions in this area that's extremely difficult to reach.

Words of Rescue

Young Kadiatou sat with his seven brothers and sisters and all the other families of their village as the *griot* stood in the middle of the large circle between two trees. Kadiatou loved when the storyteller told of their people's beginnings.

Today was extra special since one of the men played a traditional stringed instrument called a *kora* as the *griot* spoke, his voice rising and falling, his hands emphasizing the words to illustrate his meaning.

The *griot* invited another storyteller to join him. The new man seemed to speak from personal experience about a Shepherd who had sacrificed His own life to rescue those who had sinned. Kadiatou knew he had made many mistakes, but the words he'd heard from the Quran had never told of a Savior. After the storyteller finished, Kadiatou raced to speak with him. He had to hear more.



Ways to Pray

- Ask God to raise up artistic and creative teams to go to West Africa and share the Good News in ways Muslims will understand.
- Praise God for cultures like the Malinke that share stories from generation to generation. Pray that storytellers will hear and repeat the Gospel of Jesus Christ with those in their villages.
- Pray for movements of faith in Christ among entire extended families and communities.

Though her mother had told her that the girls risked God's anger, Intan could not ignore them.

As she arrived home from school after a particularly hard day, her father stopped her. Kneeling before her, he asked, "Why have you been crying?" She confessed that the other girls' words had hurt.

"You know that I sell precious stones and jewelry made of the best gold," he said. She nodded slowly before he continued. "You are more special and more beautiful than any of them."

The Beginning of Knowledge

Kaan held tighter to his father's hand as they navigated the crowded city streets to meet with a man selling a car. He tried to pay attention to the people around him, but he bumped into many of them anyway. Before him, a giant domed roof and multiple spires filled the skyline. It was unlike anything in their village.

His father had said it was a mosque. While he'd heard of them, he'd never seen one before. His people gathered in a worship center called a *cemevi*. That wasn't the only difference between how the Alevis and others in their country practiced Islam. His people also followed mystical teaching attributed to Ali.

As they passed the mosque and hundreds of people hurrying inside to worship, Kaan wondered what their prayers were like. If there were differences among Muslims, what about other religions? Though still young, he wanted to learn about what others believed.



Ways to Pray

- Pray for a spiritual curiosity among the Alevi that will lead them to explore the Word of God and discover who Jesus Christ is.
- Pray that people in all sects of Islam will seek to learn the truth on their own and not be satisfied with what they've been taught.
- Government red tape often makes it difficult for foreigners to access and stay in the country. Pray that laborers wanting to go there will have favor with the authorities.

Moroccan Imazighen

True Freedom

Once called Berbers—meaning barbarians—Beni's people were now known as Amazigh or Imazighen. Free men. Beni was free to herd his sheep through the Atlas Mountains, free to roam from one grazing spot to another, and free to return to the village where his family made their permanent home.

Soon he would move out of his father's tent and begin his own family where he would make decisions in all household manners. But Beni couldn't deny that there was one area of his life that had never felt free.

While the tenets of Islam were strict, he didn't mind the structure. But he felt trapped in the uncertainty and fear that he could never be—would never do—enough to earn forgiveness. He wondered if there was another way.

- Pray that Amazigh men and women will break free from the uncertainty of Islam and find true freedom in Christ alone.
- Pray that God will open the door for Frontiers teams to carry the Good News to North Africa.
- Ask God to draw the Imazighen to Himself through miracles and wonders.

A Heart of Compassion

Imran stood over his grandfather's fresh grave as a cold wind swept down from the mountains. His grandfather had suffered greatly throughout his life. In 1944, he, his family, and his whole Muslim people group had been accused of supporting the Nazis. Herded into rail cars at Stalin's orders, they'd been sent to Kazakhstan with no heat, no food, and little water.

His grandfather hadn't been allowed to return to his home until 1957, when he found Ingush lands had been given to another people. Imran had wanted to bury his grandfather in a centuries-old family cemetery, but new landowners wouldn't allow it.

When Imran told his boss, a foreigner from a distant land, that he couldn't find a place to bury his grandfather, his boss immediately offered to help. Together, they found a spot, and his boss even helped pay for the burial plot. After his family experienced so much hate and pain over the decades, Imran was left to wonder where such love and compassion could come from.



Ways to Pray

- Pray for Muslim people groups like the Ingush, who have been forced off their ancestral land, to discover that they were made for heaven and an eternal relationship with God.
- Pray for Ingush men and women to encounter the kind of compassion that points them to Jesus.
- Ask the Lord to prepare the hearts of the Ingush to receive and understand the Gospel.

A Traitor No More

As he lowered the hood of the car he'd just finished repairing, Umesh let out a long sigh. The car's owner had brought it to his small auto shop after it had broken down. He had made it clear that he didn't trust Umesh but had no other option.

Umesh knew that his people—the Bihari from India—were often hated by the locals. He didn't blame the Bengalis. Only a generation ago, his ancestors had sided with Pakistan in brutal conflicts, leaving many locals bitter and wary.

Recently, Umesh had begun reading the *Injil* with his friend Jon. Though first a holy book, it also contained much practical wisdom he could use in his business. He was determined to apply Jesus' teachings to his life so that all his customers had no reason to doubt him.



Ways to Pray

- Ask God to open the door for teams to reach the Bihari people and share the Good News of the Gospel.
- Pray for an end to bitterness between Bengalis and Biharis—that the peace of Jesus would reign.
- Though incredibly hard workers, many Bihari live in urban slum communities. Ask the Lord to meet their physical and spiritual needs.

Yet, Hassan had been influenced by youth in settled villages that their clan passed through. He had talked about giving up their nomadic lifestyle, and Moussa had even caught him smoking. This, among many other vices, was forbidden by *Pulaaku*.




Ways to Pray
